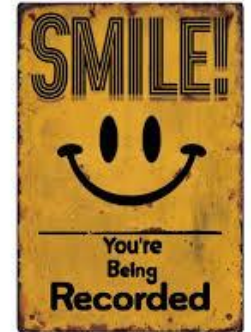


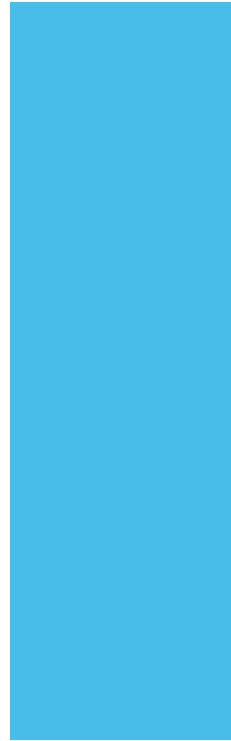
 SECURE ENTRY POINTS:
PROTECT ALL ACCESS AREAS TO YOUR
HOME

- Use high-quality locks on doors and windows
- Upgrade older fittings where possible
- Always lock up—even for short absences
- Secure garages, sheds, and side gates
- Reinforce patio doors and older UPVC fittings

CCTV AND ALARMS: VISIBLE DETERRENTS REDUCE RISK

- Install CCTV to capture clear facial images
- Link systems to mobile devices for alerts – Video doorbells are amazing.
- Use accredited installers for legal compliance
- Fit alarm boxes at front and rear of property
- Consider dummy boxes for added deterrence





 DISTRACTION BURGLARY
AWARENESS:
STAY VIGILANT AGAINST IMPOSTERS

- Ask for ID and verify credentials
- Keep unknown visitors outside until confirmed
- Contact the organisation they claim to represent
- Never feel pressured—genuine callers will understand



NEIGHBOURHOOD VIGILANCE: COMMUNITY COOPERATION PREVENTS CRIME

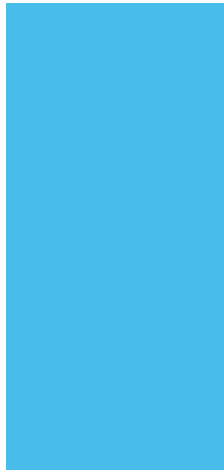
- Report suspicious activity promptly.
- Join or form a Neighbourhood Watch group.
- If someone doesn't seem right..... IT PROBABLY ISNT, CALL THE POLICE, IF UNSURE!





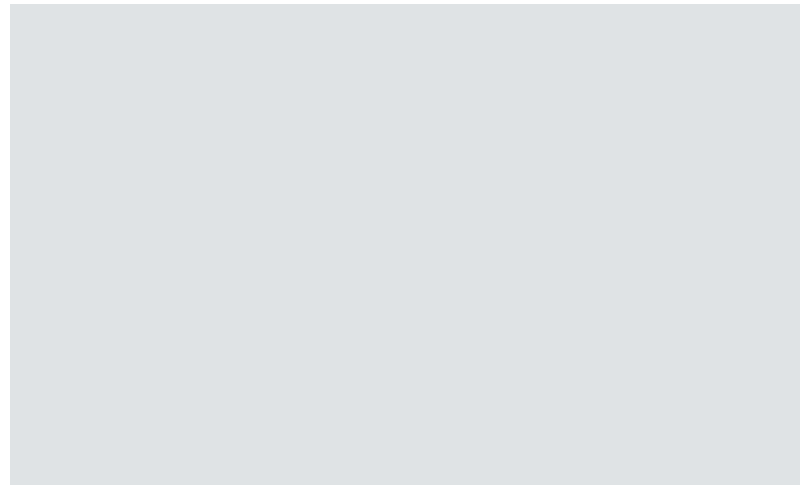
KEYLESS CAR THEFT PREVENTION **PROTECT YOUR VEHICLE FROM SIGNAL THEFT**

- Store key fobs in Faraday pouches or boxes
- Avoid placing keys near doors or windows
- Use two layers of shielding for extra protection



FINAL TIPS FOR HOME SAFETY SIMPLE HABITS MAKE A BIG DIFFERENCE

- Keep valuables out of sight
- Use light timers when away
- Mark valuables for recovery
- Store ladders and bins securely
