	Delamere Rd - bike stolen from unsecured garage

Points to note:


- Interesting that 2 properties being renovated have suffered burglaries. It doesn't say whether the properties were empty or whether it was household items or tools stolen. If you are having any work done on your house consider the effect on the security of the property.
- ☐ There appear to be more thefts of property from cars than actual vehicle theft. Make sure you lock your vehicle when you leave it and, if you must leave property inside, make sure it is out of sight.

It is possible to download and print No Trick or Treat signs (plenty of choice on Google).

If you are a parent, here are some tips for your children to keep Halloween safe:

If you're going trick or treating, make sure you go with an adult and your parent
or carer knows where you're going and when to expect you back.
Don't knock if there's a sign saying 'No trick or treat here.'

☐ Be careful not to frighten elderly or vulnerable people.

□ Don't go trick or treating alone - stay with your group.

Only visit areas where there are streetlights.
Don't throw eggs and flour.
Be careful crossing roads in the dark.
